Notice on the Safety Protocols for travelling to Nepal

- 1. All passengers must have the following documents to board a flight to Nepal:
 - i. A COVID-19 test negative report valid within 72 hours before the flight time
 - ii. A printed copy of the barcode receipt obtained after filling out the "International Traveller Online Arrival Form" available at https://ccmc.gov.np/
 - 2. Except exempted in the Clause 3 below, all passengers must have an evidence of hotel booking for 7 days' quarantine in the hotels approved by the Department of Tourism of Nepal.
 - 3. The following categories of passengers are subject to self/home quarantine for at least 10 days:
 - i. Individuals with a certificate of completed COVID-19 vaccination
 - ii. Individuals travelling for emergency purposes like funerals and mourning, with the recommendation from concerned local authorities or COVID-19 Crisis Management Center (CCMC) and a negative antigen test upon arrival
 - iii. Incapacitated persons, chronic patients, differently abled persons, and their caretakers (maximum two), with the recommendation from the concerned hospitals and a negative antigen test upon arrival
 - iv. Senior citizens above 70 years, minors below 5 years and parents' accompanying such minors, with a negative antigen test upon arrival
 - v. Government employees, security personnel, diplomats, officials of international organizations and INGOs, and their families returning to Nepal, with recommendation from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Nepal or the concerned authorities.
 - 4. All passengers staying in hotel and self/home quarantine are required to have COVID-19 test on the 7th day and the 11th day respectively of their arrival in Nepal.
- 5. Entry through land routes is not allowed for foreign travellers.
